## ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES 16-18 JULY 2019

On Tuesday 16, Wednesday 17 and Thursday 18 July 2019 we are suspending the normal school timetable and offering a wide range of activities both in and out of school. This offers an opportunity for students to extend their learning in a particular area of interest or even try something completely new.

**It must be stressed that these are compulsory days of education and attendance on a course is expected.**

Students should make their choice and return the form at the back of the booklet to Helen Radford with their non-refundable deposit as detailed in the activity description. We need to ensure that all activities will be financially viable before we make any payments on behalf of our students to confirm the bookings, hence the need for a non-refundable deposit.

**Places will be allocated on a first come first served basis on receipt of the non-refundable deposit in full (or an explanatory note if it is not possible for you to enclose it at this time).**

Further information including any additional payment dates will be provided by the activity leaders when all details have been confirmed.

Students who fail to make a final choice will be allocated to a programme of free school-based activities.

The approximate cost of each course is shown in the details, and students will be able to pay by instalments. If your child is currently eligible for Pupil Premium (Free school meals currently or in the last 6 years, services children, students in care or adopted from care) and wish to access possible support towards payment, please complete the reverse of the Student Choices Form. Pupil Premium support must be agreed at the time of sign-up for the trip activity. Please note that Pupil Premium Support cannot be guaranteed.

**The school reserves the right to alter or cancel activities that are not financially viable, withdraw students on behavioural grounds or withdraw students for non-payment if this has not been discussed and agreed with school.**

## **Message from John McCleery, Head of Year 10**

Dear Year 10 student/parents

Enrichment Week is a great opportunity for all students to experience activities and develop skills that will benefit them in the future. It is more important than ever that you make use of this opportunity as it is the last time you will be able to do so! When you move on from school, we are often asked for references by colleges, universities and employers. The more use you have made of opportunities in school, the easier it is for us to write a positive reference.

This year, there are several excellent options available to you, and to benefit fully, I urge you to make a proactive choice.

As you prepare to move on from school, it is essential that you have a wide range of experiences and skills with which to improve your chances of gaining future education and jobs. Sending the message that you can't be bothered by not making the most of this opportunity is not the best way forward.

You are free to choose from the full range of trips and activities outlined in this booklet.

I know a number of you have already enrolled on the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. This award is excellent for your personal development and demonstrates your willingness to go the extra mile and try things out of your normal comfort zone.

Another way of demonstrating this would be to sign up for work experience. I know that looking for a placement can be overwhelming, but there are staff in school who can help with this if you are finding it difficult. Successfully securing and completing a placement demonstrates your commitment to thinking about your future career and can really help you secure employment or training.

If you find revision a problem, or if you have gaps in your knowledge for some subjects, you can spend the Enrichment Days preparing revision materials or deepening your understanding on course material with staff.

<p><b>1. A Load of Balls</b> Years 8-12</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 44</p>	<p><b>Cost – Approx £55</b> Non-residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: £20</b></p>
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Over the three days students will have the opportunity to have a go at the following activities:

Visit Willows Sports Centre and get ready for **Laser Quest** and **5-A-Side Football**.

Go Extreme!!! At Wild Park Leisure and enjoy several games of **Paintballing**.

Relax a little at the Q Club and enjoy **Pool, Darts and Snooker**.

<p><b>2. Bronze Duke of Edinburgh</b> Year 10</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 52</p>	<p><b>Total DofE Cost –</b> <b>Approx £135</b> Residential</p>
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**ONLY AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE ALREADY SIGNED UP** - The Duke of Edinburgh Award is offered at Bronze level during Enrichment Week this year. Students sign up at the beginning of the year. Throughout the year they take part in 3 sections which are Physical, Skill and Volunteering.

Students will be taking their qualifying expedition during this time. This involves 2 days (1 night) of qualifying expedition plus an extra nights camping before returning to school to produce their expedition presentation.

This event will take place over 4 days.

<p><b>4. Get Ahead</b> Year 10</p> <p><b>Maximum number of students: 45</b></p>	<p><b>Cost: Free</b> Non-residential</p>
<p>Opting for this will give you the chance to work with staff preparing for your exams by revising the work completed in Year 10 and/or starting to look at the work for Year 11.</p> <p>Work will be completed individually in quiet classrooms with a range of resources available for you to get ahead of the game.</p>	

<p><b>5. Ing</b> Years 8-10</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 48</p>	<p><b>Cost – Approx £90</b> Non-residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: £30</b></p>
<p>Three days of activities <u>trying something exciting</u>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rollercoasting<u>ing</u> at Alton Towers (late return to school).</li> <li>• Go Karting<u>ing</u> at Midland Karting<u>ing</u> – Team Racing<u>ing</u>.</li> <li>• Cycling<u>ing</u>, sailing<u>ing</u> and splashing<u>ing</u> session at Carsington Water.</li> </ul> <p>Come and join in the fun!</p>	

<p><b>6. London Theatre Trip</b> Years 9-12</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 40</p>	<p><b>Cost – Approx £210</b> Part-residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: £50</b></p>
<p>We will travel by coach and hopefully visit the British Museum on arrival in London.</p> <p>Our time in the capital will then be spent seeing "Wicked" and "The Play that Goes Wrong" with an all you can eat pizza meal too!</p> <p>There will be short walking tour, shopping time in the Covent Garden Piazza and an overnight stay with an all you can eat breakfast.</p> <p>The third day will be based in school with fun activities/workshops.</p>	

<p><b>7. Netherlands Trip</b> Years 8-10</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 44</p>	<p><b>Cost – Approx £340</b> Residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: £120</b></p>
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**NOTE - This trip is now fully booked and all places are taken.**

Students will be off on an overseas residential for 3 nights to The Netherlands. We will stay in a hotel on the outskirts of the capital, Amsterdam, and over the space of 3 days, we will visit the historic city of Amsterdam, visiting various museums and a canal boat tour of the city. We will also visit Walibi Holland Theme Park. Students will be given some free time to purchase items and gifts on the trip.

<p><b>8. Push Forward in Art</b> Years 10-12</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 15</p>	<p><b>Cost: Free</b> Non-residential</p>
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- Do you want to raise your grade in Graphic or Fine Art GCSE or A-Level?
- Do you want help making your coursework even better?

Then choose Push Forward! This option allows students to focus on producing coursework to a high level in an informal, mature environment.

<p><b>9. School of Rock</b> Years 8-12</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 25</p>	<p><b>Cost - Free</b> Non-residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: None</b></p>
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For those about to rock!

Participants will learn how to put together a band, write songs and perform and record material. If in doubt, watch the film!

<p><b>10. Snowboarding at the Snowdome</b> Years 8-12</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 36</p>	<p><b>Cost - £120</b> Non-residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: £30</b></p>
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Start from scratch or improve your skills.

We have hired the Snowdome and six of its finest snowboard instructors for three days of snow filled antics. Coach travel to and from school is included. (8.15am departure from Belper School).

If you have never experienced the thrills of snowboarding before, now is the time to begin. There will be a two hour session each day with full equipment and instruction provided.

If you 'really go for it' you should be able to progress to 'recreational standard' – so you can go off on your own without an instructor by the end of day three.

If you are an existing boarder with some skills already under your belt, we will have instructors waiting to move you on to the next level. Jumps and tricks or improved turning techniques could be your focus for development.

<p><b>11. Sports Galore</b> Years 8-10</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 60</p>	<p><b>Cost - Free</b> Non-residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: None</b></p>
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Play sports all day everyday on the 'Sports Galore' enrichment activity.

At the start of each day, we will work out a programme with a wide variety of activities for the day ahead including competitions. Students will get to choose which activity they do.

Activities and competitions might include..... football, tennis, badminton, rounders, volleyball, table tennis, basketball, handball, cricket, softball, squash, swimming, water polo – whatever you want really – you decide!

Just come to school each day in some sports kit and be ready to play all day. For more information, see Steve Lawes.

<p><b>12. Step-Up and STEM</b> Year 10</p> <p>Maximum number of students: 14</p>	<p><b>Cost - £30</b> Non-residential</p> <p><b>Deposit required: £20</b></p>
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The three days on offer here are really exciting. A small group of students get the chance to work with Rolls Royce on STEM activities. You will enhance your CV's and skill base to no end and get yourself known by Rolls Royce, which may be a huge advantage when thinking about future opportunities. In addition to the time with Rolls Royce, you will receive First Aid Training by Blithfield Training Ltd. At the end of the three days, students successfully completing the training will receive a recognised First Aid Certificate.
