

Belper School PE Department - Homework Procedure Document

In line with whole school policy, students are required to undertake PE homework at Belper School as set out below. Students are also reminded of the availability of a broad range of extra-curricular activities run by the PE department which, if attended regularly, can enhance a student's progress significantly.

Key Stage 3

Students will be asked to complete a written piece of work once per term to show their understanding of an aspect of the work they have covered in their recent lessons. This piece of work will should take up no more than one side of A4 and will receive written feedback by the teacher. The focus or the work is as follows:

Year 7 – Produce an overview of a recent lesson or activity

Year 8 – Produce a coaching card for a skill recently covered in a lesson

Year 9 – Rules and Officiating – provide an overview of some of the key points of a recently covered activity.

Class teachers will provide appropriate guidance for students when tasks are set. Excellent work will be rewarded using the school merit system and outstanding work will be used as examples for other students to see on the PE noticeboards.

Teachers may also set short homeworks to develop areas covered in lessons, for example, research tasks, worksheets or practical skill rehearsal.

GCSE PE

GCSE PE students will have a copy of the department's homework policy in the front section of their course folders.

Homework for GCSE PE candidates will be made up of the following tasks:

1. Revision for any test papers
2. Writing or typing up of any class notes
3. Researching around a topic covered in class
4. Short extension tasks based on lesson content
5. Completion of exam-style questions (ESQs) which will receive detailed feedback
6. Undertaking directed revision tasks (DRTs) in Year 11 where students are required to produce a set of revision notes on a given topic.
7. Attending the extra sports practices at school at lunchtimes or after school to improve their practical scores

Excellent homework will be rewarded using the school merit system. Regular attendance at sports clubs will be rewarded using the merit system and the most committed students will be nominated for sports person of the month or the year.

A Level

Students at A Level will need to undertake the following homework tasks...

1. Revision for any test papers
2. Writing or typing up of any class notes
3. Researching around a topic covered in class
4. Short extension tasks based on lesson content
5. Completion of exam-style questions (ESQs) which will receive detailed feedback
6. Undertaking topic based tasks (TBTs) as set by class teachers – these will receive detailed written feedback.
7. Attending any available extra sports practices at school to improve their practical scores
8. Undertaking their chosen sport outside of school
9. Make a video of their performance in their chosen practical activities in accordance with guidance from staff
10. Research and preparation for their spoken coursework
