#### Notes

Belper School Private Fund is made up of individual fund accounts each of which has an agreed purpose (for example a school trip or fundraising for a charity) and an account-holder. The Fund is held in a bank account separate from the school's public funds. The year end accounts are prepared on a cash basis (no accruals, debtors or creditors).

The school Charging Policy explains how surpluses on accounts are managed. Surpluses over an agreed amount are refunded to students. Smaller balances are transferred to the Enrichment Support Account. During the year to 31 March 2021 £1785 was transferred into the Enrichment Support Account from other accounts (2019/20 £2995).
