Year 11 Visit to Beth Shalom Holocaust Centre

This month, as we commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day and mark the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, 95 of our Year 11 students visited the Beth Shalom Holocaust Centre. The impactful visit offered students the chance to deepen their understanding of this dark chapter in history and reflect on its relevance to our world today.

We were especially proud to receive the following email from someone who interacted with our students during their visit:

" I taught a group of pupils from your school today at the Holocaust centre this morning as part of my interview for a position there. I'm a primary school teacher so teaching GCSE students was a bit daunting, but I wanted to let you know what a lovely, well-behaved, and polite group they were. Please will you pass on my comments. They are a real credit to the school!"

Such feedback is a testament to the maturity and respect shown by our students on this important visit. We are immensely proud of them for representing our school so well and for their thoughtful engagement with the lessons of the Holocaust.

Year 7

Students are nearing the end of their first rotation of specialisms, they have completed projects in Design, Food and Textiles.

The students have been introduced to the workshops and made some amazingly creative PhoneBots!

This has included learning about core tools used to cut, shape and form timber. However, the students most enjoyed learning how to use CAD and casting pewter into small metal coins.

While in Textiles, the students have been introduced to the sewing machines, and developing skills in stencil design to create a range of uniquely personalised brilliant banners.

In Food, students have focused on core safety skills, including knife safety, as well as looking at the importance of healthy eating, all backed up by a range of practical lessons in the kitchens making a range of dishes, *Pizza Toast* definitely being the most popular!

In the second half of the year the students will move onto a range of more challenging activities in all three specialisms, including cold forming of metal to create a personalised coat hook, using tie dye and appliqué to create a tote bag, and continue to explore a healthy diet, and food production.

Year 8

Students are nearing the end of their first rotation of specialisms, they have completed projects in Design, Food and Textiles

They have developed timber-based skills with the introducing of wood joints to create a frame, and learning about a range of mechanisms, cams, levers and linkages which can be used to create personalised automata mechanisms.

While in Textiles, the students have taken a closer look at some of the most popular fashion brands and applied this knowledge to the production of prototype trainers, use heat print transfer, and template assembly techniques.

Students have focused in more detail on hygiene and microbiology including learning about pathogenic bacteria, fermentation and preservation. They have carried out an experiment into enzymic browning of apples.

In practical lessons they have further developed their practical skills including demonstrating the fermentation process when making bread-based pizzas and using temperature probes to check the core temperature of meat.



In the second half of the year the students will take part in a range of more challenging activities in all three specialisms, including food from around the world, projection lamps, and bucket hats.













Year 9


Students are nearing the end of their first rotation of specialisms, they have completed projects in Design, Food and Textiles.

In Design the students have assembled their first PCB based circuit to create a dark activated light, which is used to add backlighting to a CAD designed, hand-cut and painted clock based on a theme of their choice.

Textiles have partnered with a local charity shop who are provided clothing items for the students to breathe new life into as they upcycle the items. Students are applying the range of skills they have learnt over Year 7 and 8 to redevelop items which can be returned to the charity shop for resale.

Students have been learning about macro and micro nutrients in Food. Applying this knowledge to create increasingly complex dishes including, sausage rolls, curries, and learning techniques such as 'en papillote'.

In the second half of the year the students will complete their most challenging activities in all three specialisms, equipping them with skills which will prepare them for GCSE studies, including food science experiments and coding.











BTEC Construction

The students have been developing their carpentry and joinery skills be creating a range of themed gift items and traditional wooden toys.

They have also toured the construction site for the new Babington Health Centre









Students have been working on their core skills by 'making' exam questions, with some imaginative outcomes and electronic Christmas

decorations.
