Brief outline of course

Psychology is one of the fastest growing university subjects and it is an ideal platform to a wide range of careers. The course involves active learning and opportunities to conduct your own research. The course is made up of three units:

- <u>01 Research Methods</u> (2 hour examination, 30% of A Level) Students learn about the core psychological methods and have the opportunity to conduct their own primary research
- <u>02 Psychological Themes Through Core Studies</u> (2 hour examination, 35% of A Level) Students are introduced to the central areas within psychology and study both a classic and contemporary piece of research. Themes of study include; attention, regions of the brain, responses to people in authority, memory and moral development
- <u>03 Applied Psychology</u> (2 hour examination, 35% of A Level) Students study issues in mental health, child psychology and criminal psychology in greater depth in order to develop a greater understanding of key developments in these fields
