

To support them in making informed choices about their next steps, students have access to one-to-one guidance from our dedicated Careers Team, ongoing support from their tutors, and the wealth of advice and tools available through the Unifrog platform.

A reminder that the UCAS deadline for equal consideration is January 14th at 6 p.m. We strongly encourage students to submit their applications well before this date, as some of those who have already applied have begun to receive offers — an exciting and motivating milestone for many.

The same positive approach has been evident in Year 12, whose success at GCSE has given them a strong foundation for the challenges of Level 3 study. Alongside their academic courses, students have quickly settled into their core enrichment choices, including the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, Young Enterprise, Arts and Sports Leaders Awards, and, new for this year, the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). We look forward to building on last year's achievements in these areas, including becoming Regional Champions and National Finalists in the Young Enterprise Company Programme.

There has also been excellent uptake for our Sixth Form Ambassador roles, which make a valuable contribution to school life while developing students' leadership and social action skills. These experiences help students build and evidence the employability qualities that strengthen future applications beyond their academic results.

As a school, we also value the additional support our Sixth Formers provide across the community. Students are now assisting neurodiverse learners, supporting in Modern Languages lessons and the Enhanced Learning Support Centre, and taking part in Buddy Reading with Year 7 pupils, among many other activities. 
Student Experiences


